Important Information for Parents:

As an annual check-up on the education system, the Accountability Pillar, provides an opportunity for Alberta Education and school authorities to ensure that we are equipping students for success. The Accountability Pillar uses a set of 16 indicators consisting of surveys of students, parents and teachers on various aspects of quality; student outcomes such as dropout and high school completion rates; and provincial assessments of student learning.

From January to the end of February, Alberta Education will be conducting the **annual Accountability Pillar Survey**. In January, parents of students in grades 7 and 10 should have received a survey from Alberta Education. In February, students in grades 7-12 and all teachers will be completing their surveys online at school.

All surveys are anonymous and ask questions about experiences with the school. Your participation in the survey helps provide important information on the quality of education your child is receiving, so we encourage you to return your survey promptly. Survey results will be available to school authorities in May, and will be reported publicly as part of their Education Plans and Annual Education Results Reports.

New communication protocols for Hub students

At the Learning Hub, student engagement and communication directly relate to increased student success and achievement. Students who connect to their teachers regularly have a higher success rate than students who do not; therefore, we have established dates within our semester that we expect to hear from students.

We want to hear from you every 2 weeks. We want to know that you're alive and that you're progressing well in your course(s).

Student communication with their teacher(s) can happen in a variety of ways, including:

- email
- Google Meet
- stop by in person
- phone call
- Google Chat


* Students can communicate with several teachers in one email as a check-in, but an email to only one teacher doesn't count as communicating with all teachers.

Types of communication a student might make include:

- a simple check in with their teacher(s) about their progress
- a note or question regarding important assessments such as exam dates, expectations, assignment due dates, etc.
- telling teacher(s) about something you liked in the course
- telling teacher(s) something about your day or life
- interest in continuing in the course (if you would like to drop, please let us know)

If students have questions, then their message should include information such as:

- course
- assignment name or number that the student needs help with
- page number
- question number
- · attempts previously made to answer the practice problem
